Selection Criteria

Selection Criteria - Woman of the Year

- An individual currently resident in the Division of Swan.
- Demonstrates significant contribution to the community, above and beyond employment and/or student duties.
- An inspirational role model for the Swan community.
- The individual's contributions have evidence of significant impact on the Swan community.

Selection Criteria - Senior Woman of the Year

- An individual aged 60+ as of 8 March 2024.
- An individual currently resident in the Division of Swan.
- Demonstrates significant contribution to the community, above and beyond employment and/or student duties.
- An inspirational role model for the Swan community.
- The individual's contributions have evidence of significant impact on the Swan community.

Selection Criteria - Young Woman of the Year

- An individual aged 21 or under as of 8 March 2024.
- An individual currently resident in the Division of Swan.
- Demonstrates significant contribution to the community, above and beyond employment and/or student duties.
- An inspirational role model for the Swan community.
- The individual's contributions have evidence of significant impact on the Swan community.

<u>Selection Criteria – Scientist of the Year</u>

- An individual currently resident in the Division of Swan.
- A volunteer, employee, employer, educator, student and/or researcher in a STEM (science, technology, engineering and/or mathematics) field.
- Contribution in her relevant field, and how has the nominee put back into her field to support others.
- Future goals and likely impact.

• Degree of difficulty of the achievement and sacrifices made.

<u>Selection Criteria – Women's Sport Award</u>

- An individual currently resident in the Division of Swan, or; A team (group) that is based/incorporated/plays within the Division of Swan.
- An *individual or team* who participates in local organised community sport competition as an athlete, coach and/or match official.
- Demonstrates significant contributions to the Swan community by fostering inclusion, participation and a sense of belonging for local people.
- Sporting excellence and achievement will be taken into account.

Selection Criteria - Social Cohesion Award

- Open to individuals, groups, teams and organisations who have developed or are developing a project which addresses pressing social issues.
- An individual currently resident in the Division of Swan, or;
 A group, organisation or team that is based or conducts the majority of their activities within the Division of Swan
- The project may be at any stage of implementation (early advanced).
- The project has demonstrated or is very likely to result in outstanding contribution to social cohesion based on its:
 - a) Impact
 - b) Sustainability
 - c) Innovation
 - d) Replicability

To ensure the Swan IWD Awards are representative of our diverse Swan community, consideration may be given to:

- Age
- Cultural and/or linguistic background
- Field of endeavour
- Socioeconomic status
- Location

Tips for Nominating

We all know at least one woman who is making our community a better place. It could be through local sport, volunteering, school, a personal connection, work or something else.

The Swan IWD Awards are an inclusive celebration of these people.

Nominating someone for an Award is not a difficult or long process, but a way to show appreciation and respect.

Award Categories

There are six award categories open for nominations:

- 1. Swan IWD Woman of the Year Celebrating the achievements and significant contributions of an inspirational woman in the Swan community.
- Swan IWD Senior Woman of the Year Celebrating the achievements and significant contributions of an inspirational woman aged 60+ in the Swan community.
- Swan IWD Young Woman of the Year Celebrating the achievements and significant contributions of an inspirational woman aged 21 and under in the Swan community.
- Swan IWD Scientist of the Year Celebrating the achievements and significant contributions of a STEM educator, student, volunteer and/or researcher in the Swan community.
- Swan IWD Women's Sport Award Recognising an individual or team's significant contributions to Swan as an athlete, coach or match official in local organised competition.
- Swan IWD Social Cohesion Award In recognition of an individual or group's outstanding contribution to social cohesion based on the impact, sustainability, innovation and replicability of their activities.

General Tips

- Complete either an online or hard-copy nomination form and ensure it is received digitally, by email or by post before 11:59pm AWST on Friday, 23 February 2024.
- Make sure your nomination addresses the Award category's selection criteria.
- Support your nomination with personal stories, facts and/or statistics.
- Keep it simple, concise, genuine, personal and truthful.
- You can nominate a person(s) for one Award category per nomination form.
- You can submit as many nomination forms as you see fit.

The Nomination Form

Section 1 – Your details

- Fill in your name, contact number and email address
- You may keep your nomination anonymous this means the person(s) you have nominated will not be advised that you have nominated them.

• If you wish your nomination to be anonymous, please let us know in the final question of Section 3 ("Is there anything else about the nominee(s) you would like the selection panel to know?")

Section 2 – Who are you nominating?

- Let us know if you are nominating an individual or group
- Indicate one (1) Award category you would like to nominate a person(s) for
- Fill in the nominee's full name, age, current residential suburb, email address and contact number
- Let us know if you know the nominee(s) and if they are a co-founder of an organisation
- You can let us know if your nominee is Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander, from a culturally and/or linguistically diverse background, lives with disability, experiences socio-economic hardship

Section 3 – Reasons for nomination

Question 1 – Why are you nominating this person(s)?

- Outline why you believe your nominee should be considered for an Award.
- Keep it simple, personal and truthful!

Question 2 – Please give examples of the actual and/or potential impact this nominee(s) has had upon the Swan community.

- How have they changed our community in Swan (and if relevant, beyond Swan)?
- How could they change our community in Swan and/or beyond?

Question 3 – Describe the significant contributions made to the Swan community.

• Describe what your nominee has done that has inspired you to nominate them for an Award.

Question 4 – Describe how the nominee(s) are an inspirational role model for the Swan community.

- What values does your nominee(s) hold and demonstrate? What behaviours does your nominee(s) demonstrate?
- Has your nominee(s) overcome barriers and/or disadvantage?
- In short, how would you feel if you and/or a loved one emulated your nominee's character and behaviour?
- You can use a real-life example that demonstrates why your nominee(s) is an inspirational role model for the Swan community.

Question 5 – Please give examples of the nominee's excellence in their field.

• What has your nominee(s) done - or are currently doing - that is above-and-beyond expectations?

Question 6 – Is there anything else about the nominee(s) you would like the selection panel to know?

- If you would like your nomination to be anonymous, please note it here.
- You can let us know here if there is anything else about your nominee(s) that should be considered.
